**Truth police** was developed by FL CAN Jacksonville Director Scott Bledsoe in 1999 to force political leaders to make public statements on drug policy reform.

**Truth Police** is currently a part of the "If not now, When? If not you, Who?" campaign to identify pro-cannabis candidates.

**Truth Police** volunteers can attend any public forum. At public forums Truth Police ask candidates a series of direct questions.

**Truth Police** volunteers come from various organizations, social, economic, and educational backgrounds.

**Truth Police** are operating statewide to publically "out" candidates positions on drug policy issues.

**Truth Police** is a necessary element to the agenda of State Drug Policy Reforms. In order to promote sane drug policy's that regulate the use of drugs and appropriate treatment for abusers we must identify and elect new leaders.

**Truth Police** record responses and relay them to FL CAN for statewide publication.

Truth Police exercises have come in a variety of styles. From elaborate setups to simple one on one meetings.

In 1999, FL CAN officers created an elaborate Truth Police by organizing a demonstration at the Florida Association of Counties meeting in Orlando. Organizers invited media and asked FL Drug Czar James McDonough if he advocated arresting AIDS patients and Glaucoma sufferers. While he declined to answer that question he was quoted by the Associated Press as saying "Medical Marijuana is akin to Folklore, home remedy and witchcraft"

More recently, candidate for FL House District 31 Jodi James was working at a Habitat for Humanity project. Her association with FL CAN wasn't known to the gathering. A lone man approached the candidate, saying he' had heard her speak and had one question "Where do you stand on medical marijuana"

Every citizen has the right to attend and speak at any city and county council meetings. Check with your city clerk for time and places of local governmental meetings, as well as times of citizens comments and speaking on agenda items.

## Things to Remember

- You can do this alone or with a Truth Police squad
- If a number of you go together, separate once inside to cover more space
- Each volunteer should have a list of the same questions
- Once a question is asked carefully & Accurately record the answer
- Do not carry contraband
- Report responses to FL CAN along with name of candidate, where the forum was and who was with you
